Join us in the Shadyside neighborhood of Pittsburgh for an immersive six day camp for Suzuki students and families studying cello, flute, guitar, piano, viola, or violin. You will experience wonderful teachers, inspiring classes, concerts, friendship, and the joy of making music with others. There are programs for all levels from Pre-Twinkle to Pre-College students. The camp begins on Sunday afternoon, August 2, 2020, and ends at around 6:00pm on Friday, August 7. The normal weekday hours are 9:00am to 4:30pm, though younger students may be done earlier. Program Description

We begin on Sunday afternoon with Registration at noon and then a full slate of classes. Each day, students will have a **Masterclass**, where three or four students share a lesson with a teacher, a **Group Class**, where students of the same instrument play together, and **Electives**. Students in Suzuki Book 3 and beyond will have more classes, including an **Ensemble** and perhaps a **Technique Class**. Since the day includes extra hours, it's possible to sign up for extra Electives if there are appropriate options that fit into a student's schedule. Parents are expected to be with their children up to age 12. If that is not possible, see our **Buddy Program** described on our website.



Those students who are age 12 and beyond and ready for a more serious program can enroll in the **Boot Camp**, which requires an audition. See our website for information.



Additional Activities

Several times during the week, students of each instrument gather with their friends for **Play-in's**, which give them a chance to play the Suzuki repertoire together. We have **Family Choir**, a chance for everyone to sing together, each morning, and several **Visual Art** classes, including a camp-wide art project. In the evenings we have a faculty concert, a Pajama Play-in, a voluntary student recital, and perhaps even an outdoor concert, weather permitting. The final concerts of the week take place on Friday afternoon.

The Winchester-Thurston School

Registration, Cancellation, Scholarships

Registration fees will change with the date of receipt of online registration. They are charged per family. Before May 1, \$25; before June 1, \$35; before July 1, \$45; until July 15, \$55. No registrations accepted after July 15, 2020.

Tuition will be refunded only till July 15, 2020, with a \$50 administrative fee deducted.
